REPORTS OF COMMITTEES:

FINANCE:

Mr. Voorman presented the Treasurer's Report for the month of September (copy attached) along with the vouchers and the monthly financial reports for Mott MacDonald and Cleary Giacobbe. He recommended the vouchers be paid as presented.

PURCHASING and PERSONNEL:

Mr. Phelan presented a plaque to Rich Eickhoff, commemorating his accomplishment of "25 Years of Service" with the Authority. The Board congratulated Rich on this achievement. There were no other Personnel Actions for the month of September.

PLANT OPERATIONS:

Mr. Schmidt referred to the Operating Report on the table, noting that the flows are down due to drier weather. Mr. DeGraw reported that the Authority recently had a PEOSH inspection. This is the first inspection in 12 years and resulted in seven items to be remediated. Overall the Authority fared reasonably well in the inspection. The Authority also recently had a DEP inspection which also went well.

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget as introduced reflects Total Revenues of \$11,814,350, Total Appropriations, including any Accumulated Deficit if any, of \$11,814,350 and Total Unrestricted Net Position utilized of \$0; and

WHEREAS, the Capital Budget as introduced reflects Total Capital Appropriations of \$4,202,000 and Total Unrestricted Net Position planned to be utilized as funding thereof, of \$1,835,626; and

WHEREAS, the schedule of rates, fees and other charges in effect will produce sufficient revenues, together with all other anticipated revenues to satisfy all obligations to the holders of bonds of the Authority, to meet operating expenses, capital outlays, debt service requirements, and to provide for such reserves, all as may be required by law, regulation or terms of contracts and agreements; and

WHEREAS, the Capital Budget/Program, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:31-2 does not confer any authorization to raise or expend funds; rather it is a document to be used as part of the said Authority's planning and management objectives. Specific authorization to expend funds for the purposes described in this section of the budget, must be granted elsewhere; by bond resolution, by a project financing agreement, by resolution appropriating funds from the Renewal and Replacement Reserve or other means provided by law.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the governing body of the Pequannock, Lincoln Park and Fairfield Sewerage Authority, at an open public meeting held on September 11, 2019 that the Annual Budget, including all related schedules, and the Capital Budget/Program of the Pequannock, Lincoln Park and Fairfield Sewerage Authority for the fiscal year beginning, December 1, 2019 and ending November 30, 2020, is hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the anticipated revenues as reflected in the Annual Budget are of sufficient amount to meet all proposed expenditures/expenses and all covenants, terms and provisions as stipulated in the said Authority's outstanding debt obligations, capital lease arrangements, service contracts, and other pledged agreements; and
